**1. ANNOUNCEMENT AND SPECIAL INFORMATION**

Quoters are required to read and understand and comply with all information contained within this Request for Quotes (“RFQ”). All quotes, including any price quotations, are binding upon quoter for sixty (60) calendar days from the Quote Due Date. All payments for services will be paid in accordance with Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 293.462. Quotes received after the Quote Due Date/Time indicated above will not be considered, unless it is in the best interest of the university to do so. If authorized in this RFQ, resulting contract, travel, and other expenses will only be reimbursed in accordance with the Oregon Institute of Technology (“Oregon Tech”) Contractor’s Travel Reimbursement Policy in effect at the time the expense is incurred.

It will be the responsibility of the quoter to refer daily to the Oregon Public Universities Business and Bid Opportunities website (<https://www2.wou.edu/nora/orpu.bid.home>) to check for any available addenda, response(s) to clarifying questions, cancellations, or other information pertaining to this RFQ.

**2. SCOPE**

The purpose of this RFQ is hire one (1) qualified and licensed Contractor for the Learning Resource Center (LRC) – Carpet Replacement Project at the Oregon Tech Klamath Falls, OR Campus. The scope of the project is as follows:

- Remove and dispose of existing glued down carpet, approximately seven thousand square feet (7,000 sq/ft). Please reference Exhibit B, LRC Floorplan.
- Prep work area.
- Installation of 2’x 2’ Mowhawk Creative Sparks 90% Main Body (589) and 5% of other two (2) carpet tiles (575 and 569). Please reference Exhibit C, Mowhawk Group – Carpet Specifications.
- No cove base is to be included in the project.

Owner is responsible for clearing the project space of furniture.

Prevailing Wage Rates requirements apply to this Project because the maximum compensation for all Owner-contracted Work is more than \$50,000. 11. **QUOTE WITHDRAWALS:** Quotes may be withdrawn by request in writing signed by an authorized representative and received by Oregon Tech prior to quote closing time. Quotes may also be withdrawn in person before quote closing time upon presentation of appropriate identification.
12. **QUOTE SUBMISSION:** Quotes must be submitted to Oregon Tech Purchasing and Contract Services Office in the location designated in the introduction of the RFQ via the method indicated. 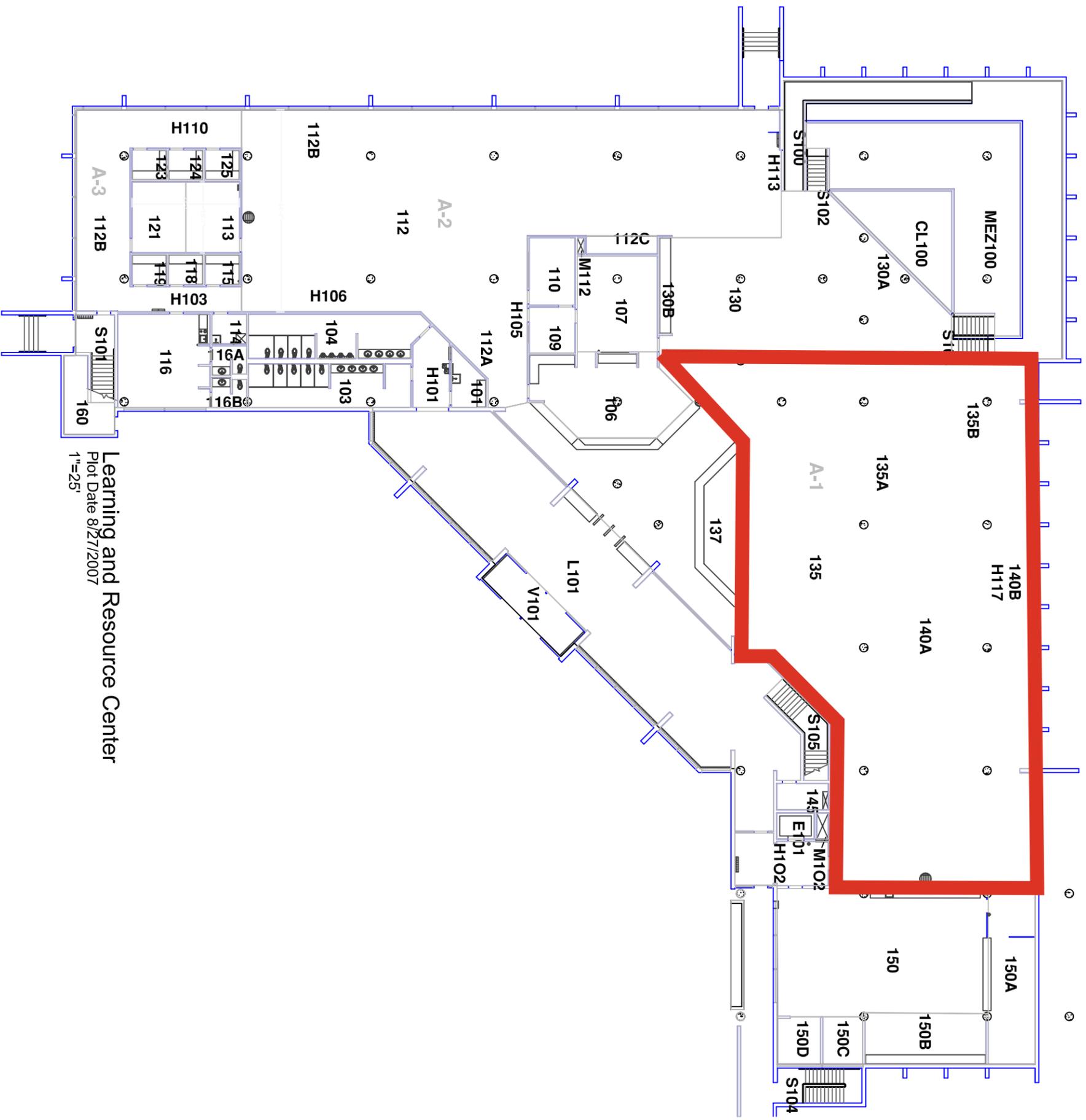

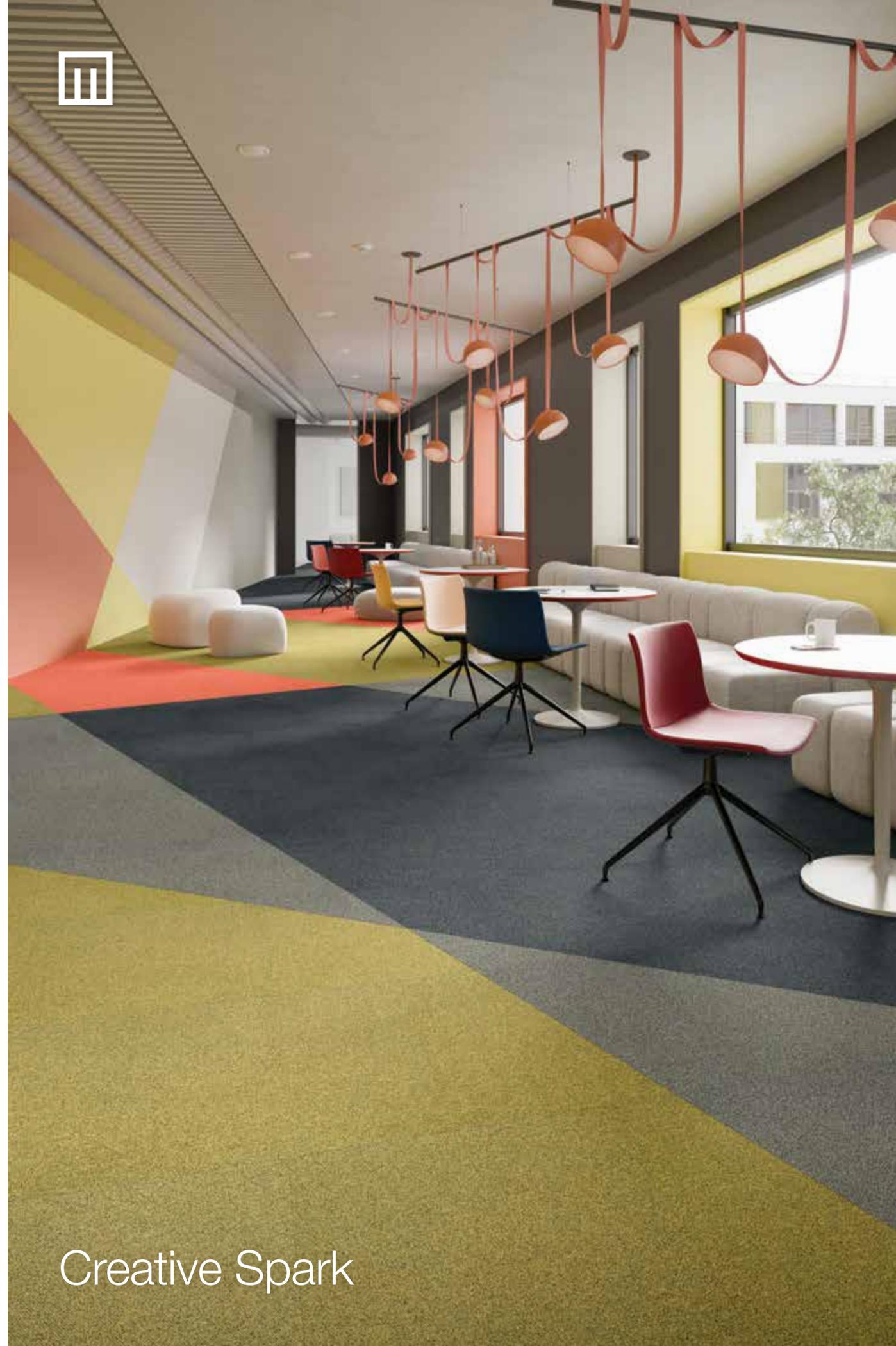
